Casualties: 8,051 (by the TSUNAMI)

181 fatalities, 1 missing, 293 injured

Amount of debris: roughly 627,000 ton Inundated Areas: 29km (48% of the city) Damage to resident: 736 destroyed

509 with extensive damage

1,097 with half damage 3,086 with partial damage

Total: 5.428 houses

The Millennium Hope Hills

(Disaster Risk Reduction)

We construct 15 hills in the coastal area making use of renewable debris.

They can attenuate the power of tsunami and become evacuation site. We connect a hill and hill with raised trail paths. Volunteers plant young trees and will grow to big trees and will be green embankment in the future.
